
LIGHT INDUSTRY & SCIENCE PARK III STO. TOMAS, BATANGAS

A 109-hectare industrial park accessible from Manila via the South Luzon Expressway (SLEX) and the Southern Tagalog Arterial Road (STAR Tollway) which also connects it to Batangas City and its international seaport



LIGHT INDUSTRY & SCIENCE PARK IV MALVAR, BATANGAS

SPPI's sixth and latest industrial estate is being developed as part of an integrated mixed-use property development called Malvar Cybergreen. LISP IV is planned to be a 200-hectare industrial park, complemented by a 10-hectare vibrant commercial and institutional destination and a 40-hectare residential neighborhood right off the Star Tollway in Malvar.



LIGHT INDUSTRY & SCIENCE PARK I CABUYAO, LAGUNA

Sold out in 1995, this 175-hectare industrial estate was the first to be registered as a special economic zone by the Philippine Economic Zone
Authority. LISP I is situated 35
kilometers south of Makati, the prime
central business district of the country, and is home to 90 locators including Fortune 500 companies like Procter



SPPI's second industrial park which was sold out in two years, is only 6 kilometers from LISP I. It has an area of 65 hectares and home to 24 major multinational locators



A 62-hectare industrial estate located in Mactan Island, one of the Philippines' fastest growing regions. It is a mere 10-minute drive or less than 8 kilometers away from either the Mactan Cebu International Airport or the Cebu International Seaport.





HERMOSA ECOZONE INDUSTRIAL PARK

- 162—hectare industrial estate • Part of a 478-hectare mixed-use property
- development located in Hermosa, Bataan · Located right in the middle of the country's growth corridor of Subic Bay Freeport Zone in Zambales and Clark Special Economic Zone in Pampanga.
